



Ganalili Transitional Housing Program

Participant Support Service Obligations

The Yindjibarndi Aboriginal Corporation has constructed nine transitional housing units and a commercial training facility to enable apprentices and low-income employees' access to suitable, stable, affordable accommodation; and a pathway to private rental or home ownership.

Ganalili Transitional Housing Program is a housing and support program for Aboriginal people living in the Roebourne, Wickham or Karratha area. Participants in the program will have affordable rent and access support services to gain independent living skills to improve employment, training, financial capacity and health and well-being. Participants in the program will be required to attend workshops and engage with support services that are recommended to them by the program.

Participants in the Ganalili Transitional Housing facility must agree to engage with monthly workshops that may be in an informal setting, monthly BBQ as well as formal individual support meetings.

Application to the program is open to all Aboriginal people in the local area, however preference will be given to employees of Yurra.

Ganalili Transitional Housing is an alcohol and pet free facility.

Support services will be individually tailored to the needs of the participant to support them to set and work towards their goals (which may include employment, training, finances, health, and wellbeing).

Support services may include, but is not restricted to the following:

- Financial management - making the most of your money and learning to budget and save.
- Alcohol and Drug prevention – making the right decisions and choices.
- Learning about nutrition, and how to eat healthy.
- Setting yourself up for the week -meal preparation for the week.
- Grocery shopping and using 'click and collect'.
- Wellbeing – Act, Belong, Commit
- Cultural, heritage, history, and language.
- Household maintenance skills.
- Transitioning to Home ownership, home loan application support.
- Where tenants are referred to a support service, e.g. financial counselling, they are expected to attend meetings/workshops as required. Support services and workshops are designed to assist tenants transition into private rental or home ownership or other alternative housing.
